



Norwalk Community College Continuing Education & Workforce Development Professional Bartending Certification Course

The Professional Bartending course includes the state and national Servers and Managers Alcohol Responsibility Training (SMART) certification recognized by the Connecticut Department of Liquor Control and police departments. Students will learn how to (a) serve alcohol responsibly, (b) spot signs of intoxication, (c) respond appropriately, and (d) prepare 100 drinks from gin-and-tonics to daiquiris. Instruction focuses on opening and closing procedures, product knowledge, speed of preparation, and people skills. Upon successful completion of the course, students will be qualified to work in any environment that serves liquor, including restaurants, clubs, hotels, and catering companies.

Please Note: Students must be 18 years of age or older.
